April 4th, 2022 Job Posting - Programs Manager

Located at the University of British Columbia, The Bike Kitchen provides UBC students and the wider community with an accessible environment where they can learn about bicycle maintenance and cycling as a safe and sustainable means of transportation. The Bike Kitchen is hiring a new Programs Manager for a full-time position (40 hours per week) on a 2 year renewable contract, beginning May 2nd, 2022.

The Programs Manager (PM) directs programs and outreach to engage the UBC and broader Vancouver community. The Bike Kitchen is governed by a student and community Board of Directors, who oversee and guide the vision and mission of the organization. The PM oversees operations and works closely with the Bike Kitchen's Shop Manager to coordinate operations. Both managers hold equivalent roles as department managers.

The Programs Manager, as the most senior staff member of the Bike Kitchen's programs office, acts as the management and administrative core. Focusing on the portfolios of Education and Outreach, the PM strives to build strong community-based programming, provide learning and personal growth opportunities for students and community members, and spread awareness of cycling and its benefits for community health, sustainability and social justice. The Programs Manager also holds a leadership role in supporting the organization's growth, advising and supporting long-term development.

The Programs Manager is employed by and reports to the Board of Directors of the AMS Bike Co-op, seeking their approval on projects and new program proposals. Daily operations and staff management are left to the discretion of the PM, with the understanding that they act on behalf of the Board and in the best interests of the Bike Kitchen. The direct report for the Programs Manager is the Vice-President of the AMS Bike Co-op.

The PM supervises the work of 2-5 part-time employees of the programs office, including program and volunteer coordinators, program assistants and outreach assistants as needed.

Qualifications

- 2-3 years management and/or leadership experience
- Understanding of and commitment to anti-oppressive values and social justice
- Experience managing staff, including hiring, scheduling and supervision
- Experience with volunteer management, including engagement and managing resources
- Experience with community program development, administration and facilitation
- Excellent organizational skills, including database and record keeping
- Experience with budgeting and financial oversight
- Experience with grant writing, with proven experience at successfully obtaining funding and following through on documentation and reporting deliverables
- Knowledge of the cycling community, specifically community bike shops
- Strong interpersonal skills and an ability to understand and appreciate different perspectives
- Strong professional communication skills (both written and verbal)
